In order to complete your taxes, one (1) piece of Government or Standard ID from the lists below is required, or two (2) pieces of Secondary ID from the Secondary Identification list.

Government Identification (one item from the list below)

- Partner issued ID
- Correctional Service Canada ID
- Provincial government ID
- Photocopied government ID verified/stamped by a welfare office

Standard Identification (one item from the list below)

- Drivers License (with photo & signature)
- Provincial health card (with photo & signature)
- University/College ID
- Passport (with photo & signature)
- First Nations Status Card (with photo & signature)

Secondary Identification (any two items from the list below)

- Transit Pass
- Employer ID
- School ID
- Government Health Care
- Credit/debit Card
- SIN
- Birth Certificate



Canadian tax checklist

So, before you get started on your taxes, make sure you have all the receipts and income records you need.

Here's a handy checklist:

Slips

- T4 slips (Employment income)
- Employment insurance benefits (T4A or T4E)
- COVID-19 relief repayments (T4A)
- T2202 Tuition and Enrollment Certificate
- Old Age Security and CPP benefits (T4A-OAS, T4AP)
- Other pensions and annuities (T4A)
- Social assistance payments (T5007)
- Workers' compensation benefits (T5007)
- Advance Canada Workers Benefit (CWB) payments (RC210)
- All other information slips

Receipts

- Support for a child, spouse or common-law partner
- Professional or union dues
- Tool expenses
(Tradespersons & apprentice mechanics)
- Other employment expenses
- Medical expenses

Receipts (continued)

- Child care expenses
- Adoption expenses
- Moving expenses
- Interest paid on student loans
- Carrying charges and interest expenses
- Labour Mobility Deduction for Tradespeople
